ORDINANCE NO. 634

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HATFIELD,
MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, REPEALING
ORDINANCE NO. 626 WHICH ADOPTED RESPONSIBLE
CONTRACTOR PROVISIONS; REPEALING INCONSISTENT
ORDINANCE; CONTAINING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND
PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE**

WHEREAS, on May 11, 2011, the Board of Commissioners of Hatfield Township enacted Ordinance No. 626 which adopted provisions that governed responsible contractors; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined that the responsible contractor provisions, as set forth in Ordinance 626, are not in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Hatfield Township, and thus desires to repeal the provisions governing responsible contractors;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of Hatfield Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by authority of same as follows:

1. Ordinance No. 626 is repealed in its entirety.
2. All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.
3. This Ordinance is declared to be severable. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, or on the provisions of the Code of Ordinance of Hatfield Township.
4. This Ordinance shall be effective five (5) days following its legal enactment.
